

BANKSIA



Banksia blechnifolia

An attractive West Australian ground cover with woolly, red new growth. Flowers are displayed during Spring. Ideal for home gardens and rockeries.

Banksia repens

A creeping variety. The branches spread just below the ground surface with deeply lobed foliage. Spring flowering. Ideal for sandy/well drained soils.

Banksia prionotes 'Acorn Banksia'

A large shrub with striking triangular toothed margins. Large orange acorn shaped flowers appear from Summer to Winter. Banksia prionotes 'Dwarf' reaches only 1.5-2m tall.

Banksia integrifolia 'Sentinel'

An upright variety bred for narrow spaces making it ideal for home gardens, screens and feature planting. Foliage is dark green with silver undersides. Flowers from late summer to winter.



Banksia menziesii

A decorative banksia with thick woolly branches and dark green serrated leaves. Flowers during Autumn and Winter make this tree a stunning ornamental for the garden. Great for attracting birds. For a smaller version Banksia menziesii 'Dwarf' grows to 1.5 x 1.5m.

Banksia nivea

A compact native with narrow, saw-toothed, long leaves. Flowering is from late spring-summer. Great for creating texture and contrast.

Banksia praemorsa 'yellow'

A decorative Banksia to 4m with dense, silvery-green foliage. Large flowers in winter. Ideal for windbreaks and attracting birds.

Banksia ashbyi 'Dwarf'

Dense, long leathery serrated foliage. Flowers in winter to spring. Ideal for waterwise gardens and attracting birds and insects.



Banksia hookeriana
An ornamental shrub that adds intrigue and beauty to gardens and cut flower decorations. Acorn shaped flowers in autumn. Highly popular in the cut flower trade due to their vibrancy, size and long vase life.
