Grevillea Gin Gin Gem

A hardy, fast growing ground cover. Spreads up to 3m wide and produces masses of small red flowers during winter and spring. A proven performer with landscapers for roundabouts, verges and general garden use. Dry tolerant once established.

Grevillea olivacea

A dense shrub with narrow olive-like foliage. It has a long flowering period with an abundance of red spider flowers from winter to early summer. Bird attracting and perfect for screens and hedging.



Grevillea LegacyFlame

A low spreading shrub with a compact habit. Foliage is long and narrow but not prickly. A great low maintenance variety for small gardens.

Grevillea lanigera 'Mt Tamboritha'
A tough, reliable groundcover with narrow, pointed almost succulent like green foliage. A hardy variety ideal for covering embankments and growing under trees. Attracts nectar feeding birds and insects. Prune to tidy after flowering.

Grevillea Loopy Lou

A small low maintenance shrub with year round flowers. This hardy, fast growing variety is great for containers, coastal gardens and useful in erosion control. Tolerates light frosts.

Grevillea crithmifolia prostrata

A ground cover with a low spreading habit. In spring it has eye catching clusters of white pom pom flowers. Very effective as a weed suppressing ground cover when planted in multiples. Flowers attract small birds and insects. Performs well in coastal conditions.

Grevillea Dorothy Gordon ⓘ

A large yet compact shrub with grey-green fern-like leaves and attractive bronze new leaf tips. Unusually coloured mauve pink flowers appear through most of the year attracting nectar feeding birds. Looks great as an informal hedge and screen as well as making good cut flowers.
