

### **Fraxinus griffithii 'Flowering Ash'**

A fast growing, small tree to 7m. White flowers in spring are followed by decorative, large seed clusters. A great shade tree for parks and large gardens.

### **Talipariti (Hibiscus) tiliaceum 'Rubrum'**

The Cottonwood is a spreading tree to 6m. Ideal as a windbreak/hedge it has red heart shaped leaves and large yellow tropical flowers in spring to summer. Performs best in full sun.

*Eucalyptus caesia 'Silver Princess'*  
Weeping white-coated branches carry a profusion of flowers in Winter and Spring. The juvenile leaves are rounded with mature leaves, long and slender. It has an open habit therefore unsuitable as a dense shade tree.

# TREES



**Eucalyptus erythrocorys**  
'Red Cap Gum'  
A spectacular flowering gum with flowers from February to April. It has generally smooth bark with the occasional darker, rough patch. A popular street tree.

**Tipuana tipu** 'Pride of Bolivia'  
A fast growing, semi-evergreen tree with compound leaflets. Brilliant bright yellow flowers appear in late summer. Prune while young to encourage good structure.

**Eucalyptus forrestiana** 'Fuchsia Gum'  
A native small tree to 7m with ornamental flowers in summer. A popular choice for parks, roadside plantings and windbreaks. Also useful to control wind erosion.

**Melaleuca linariifolia** 'Snow in Summer'  
A bushy tree to 10m with a decorative, paperbark trunk. Masses of creamy-white flowers look spectacular in summer. A fast growing tree ideal for screens & windbreaks.

**Agonis flexuosa** 'Willow Peppermint'  
An Australian native to 12m. It has an attractive weeping habit and the leaves have a faint peppermint aroma when crushed. White flowers in spring.
